I am not the Man that stands out the front of our Marae, I am one of the many who are in the back ensuring You enjoy the spoils that Nga Potiki has to offer. I am not the student that went through to University, I was made to leave school at 14 to work for my Dad who at the time He and George McLeod were running what was primarily a sheep Farm up here. So, I am a graduate in the University of Life as a Son of Nga Potiki. I am not the person who will speak without thinking or make a rash decision because everyone else thinks it's the right thing to do. And like many here today, I have watched where urban sprawl is now joining where I once rode my horse, Tonka, unhindered from Mangatawa to Te Akau. Where Mum n Dad once grew Squash, Sweetcorn and Asparagus. Where I once worked at Ronnie Evans pig farm, to what is now intense residential housing. All looming ever closer to our Maunga, Mangatawa. Where, from our homestead, I could drive our tractor through from Kairua Road all the way to Karikari to set our nets, with no reservation due to the Ponds or restriction due to fences, gates and signing in for health and safety measures at the Office. Where Mangatawa and its surrounding lands and waterways were and continue to be Ours to work in, to live in and to play in. I am aware that the horse has already bolted, and there are past decisions that cannot be undone. But I am a staunch advocate for sustainable development and see my role here if successful will be to ensure that those who live here, will continue to live and play in a place that ensures our continued health and wellbeing now and into the future.
